





Eumorfopoulos first started collecting English ceramics with an occasional foray into medieval and renaissance art. His interest soon became focused on Chinese ceramics and it was here that he became an enthusiastic devotee and collector of Chinese art in all its forms. His growing collecting interest coincided with the time when railway construction in China in the early 20th century led to the discovery and opening of numerous tombs. This, combined with the fall of the Qing dynasty, led to a surge in available material of an excellent quality and Eumorfopoulos' commercial success enabled him to indulge fully his collecting instincts. He bought extensively in the field of Han Tang and Song wares, forming a collection remarkable in its extent and representative nature. Even in his lifetime the collection had become extremely well-known and attracted scholars and visitors from around the world. Pieces were continually on loan to exhibitions both at home and abroad. Ultimately, with failing health and faltering business interests in the 1930s, Eumorfopoulos allowed his collection to be bought for the nation at an extremely generous price. His collection forms an important part of the British Museum and Victoria and Albert Museum holdings. The collection, even today, remains one of the largest and finest assembled by an individual. 




