Its colophon marks it, in true Cultural Revolutionary style, as firstly the production of 'Worker Peasant Soldiers' (Gong Nong Bing huakan), while, in greater detail, explains that it was drafted by the Revolutionary Committee of the Mao Zedong Thought Propaganda Department of Jieshou District, Anhui Province, and that is was edited and produced by Propaganda and Military Teams posted to the Anhui Provincial Museum of Mass Art and its Revolutionary Committee. The original papercuts would have taken huge skill to do.



The title of this poster is taken from the two vertical banners hanging to each side of the Great Hall of the People. This poster marks two key events which began the Cultural Revolution - the CCP Central Committee document issued May 16 1966 - the initial political declaration of the Cultural Revolution and, secondly, the decisions of the 11th Plenum of the 8th Central Committee which cemented decisions made by Mao when starting the Cultural Revolution. The Central Committee in effect ceased to function thereafter and many members were purged. These two events are cited in the two white placards in the centre of the poster. The Cultural Revolution then entered its most frenetic stage, here demonstrated by the fervour and turmoil of political activity by the thousands of activists present.



Large and heavy catalogue of an impressive exhibition at the Meishuguan (National Art Museum of China) in Beijing held to commemorate the 90th anniversary of the founding of the Communist Party of China. The exhibits are divided into sections covering the historical periods from 1921-1949; 1949-1978 and 1978-2011. Within each section there are works dating from the period, together with works produced at a later date. The exhibits are primarily paintings but also include some early woodblock prints and sculpture. The large majority of exhibits come from the collection of the Meishuguan which, as the foremost official art gallery in China, holds an unparalleled collection of officially-approved material from these 90 years. A few loans from other collections in China. A total of some 350 works by leading Chinese artists past and present. Many of the original paintings shown have been used in propaganda posters. Illustrated throughout with high quality colour plates. Text in Chinese. Not easy to obtain as the majority of the print run of this catalogue has been given to high-level Chinese government officials to commemorate the anniversary.

A set of 26 colour posters from the 1970s staking China's historic claim to the Xisha archipelago in the South China Sea. The archipelago is better known as the Paracel Islands and is claimed by both China and Vietnam and has been the cause of diplomatic squabbles between the two over the last few years as China grows more assertive in the area. This set combines cultural revolution propaganda with historical claim and the content of the posters ranges from images of 'archaeologists' finding Tang and Song dynasty ceramics on the islands and Qing dynasty inscribed stone tablets from the Guangxu reign through to images of modern-day Chinese soldiers undertaking military exercises and conducting everyday life off duty. A fine Communist propaganda compilation produced in the immediate aftermath of the Cultural Revolution period, the Death of Mao and the Fall of the Gang of Four. The 60 colour plates show various glorious battles and deeds in the 50 year history of the Peoples Liberation Army (PLA) together with illustrations of selfless and model military behaviour. The plates also underline the primacy of the role of Mao Zedong in the PLA's history and success. It thus links the PLA inextricably with the legacy of Mao and seeks to underline the legitimacy of the PLA's primary role in Chinese politics. The role of the PLA in Chinese politics and the legacy of Mao were key political issues at the time that this compilation was produced. A further interesting aspect is how little Mao's successor, Hua Guofeng, features in the compilation - just three plates depict him. The PLA senior generals never truly accepted Hua Guofeng and rapidly threw their lot in with their battle-hardened veteran comrade, Deng Xiaoping, following his rehabilitation just before Mao's death. The compilation thus demonstrates the sidelining and near irrelevance of Hua Guofeng. A fascinating tool for examining the use of art in the Chinese politics of the time. On the artistic level, a good survey of the officially-sanctioned art and artists of the time. Includes traditional Chinese paintings, oil paintings, woodblock prints, New Year prints and propaganda posters. The compilation is complete with the 60 plates.

To assist with the identification of the plates (and to keep them in order!) we have numbered the list of contents from 1-60 and numbered each plate on the back.

We also include an English translation of the titles of the plates, type of work and the artists. Main text in Chinese. It is rare to find complete sets of these propaganda collections as plates were often removed to be individually displayed or removed due to 'incorrect political content' brought about by changing political winds and propaganda campaigns. 


