A total of some 120 objects. In three main sections: Desk Accourrements, Incense Paraphernalia, Miscellaneous Objects. Informative essays accompany. In English with Chinese captions to the illustrations. A useful addition to the limited literature on this subject.

Well-illustrated work on major archaeological discoveries in China in 2023 dating from ancient times through to the Ming. 30 sites are shown and described. Ever informative. List of contents, descriptions of each find and captions in English. Main text in Chinese.

Large and heavy two-volume work studying Qing dynasty ceramics made for court use during the Qing dynasty. The term now coined for these ceramics appears to be 'dayun' (mass production). Whilst thousands of such ceramics were produced, all were to an exceptionally high quality. They were viewed as distinct from the two other categories produced for the court - 'chuanban' (commissioned specifically by the Emperor) and 'gongci' (pieces presented as tribute to the Emperor). Dayun ceramics were produced from the Kangxi through to the Xuantong reigns and are of much use for the study of the characteristics and evolvement of firing techniques throughout the Qing dynasty and seeks to resolve a number of academic questions. Five essays accompany. This work also serves as a comprehensive survey of Qing dynasty imperial ceramic production. The illustrations are arranged by types of design - lotus, birds-and-flowers, phoenix etc. etc. - and chronologically within each section. Nearly 300 ceramics are illustrated, many in multiple views. It seems that a good number have not been previously published. Introductions, list of contents, brief abstracts to the essays, and captions to plates in English. Main text in Chinese.

Catalogue of a second exhibition on the all-important subject of tea in Chinese culture held at the Gugong Museum in Beijing in 2024. A large, extensive and, frankly, terrific volume. The contents come under the general title of: 'Part 2: The Way of Tea Reveres Harmony'. Shows a couple of very early Warring States items, then extensive amounts of Tang and Song ceramics, a few Yuan examples, some Ming items and extensive amounts of simply superb Qing ceramics, many from the imperial collection. The ceramics accompanied by very fine examples of paintings, woodblock-printed books and other objects pertaining to the development and spread of the culture and philosophy of tea in China over the millennia. The majority of the exhibits from the Gugong Museum collection but with loans from other institutions. A number of items definitely not previously published. Introduction, list of plates and captions to plates in English. Main text in Chinese.

Catalogue of a third exhibition on the all-important subject of tea in Chinese culture held at the Gugong Museum in Beijing in late 2024. This very interesting volume is in two main sections reflecting the exhibition's content: Part 3: Tea Roads Extending to the World. Part 4: Tea's Everlasting Fragrance. Part 3 examines the international spread and influence of tea outside China and its rise and use as a beverage in Japan, Europe and elsewhere. There are interesting and little-seen loans from, amongst others. the Victoria and Albert Museum and the State Hermitage Museum. Part 4 examines the various types of tea. Illustrated throughout with many fine and unusual objects. Introductions, lists of plates and captions to plates in English. Main text in Chinese. Four essays accompany with brief abstracts in English.

Catalogue of an exhibition at the Gugong in Beijing that is testament to the virtuosity and skill of the craftsmen who worked in the palace workshops and elsewhere producing art objects for the Qing imperial court. The focus is on hanging screens that would have adorned the walls of palaces and halls in the Forbidden City. The exhibition is in four sections by theme: Picturesque Landscapes; A Multitude of Lives; Delightful Elegance; The Elegance of Brush and Ink. A total of 51 outstanding exhibits (some comprising pairs and groups) are illustrated in colour, many in multiple views (some foldouts) and showing close-up exquisite detail. Introduction, list of plates, captions to plates and abstracts to accompanying essays in English. Main text in Chinese.

The earliest extant illustrated edition of this ancient Chinese lexicon (and sometime Classic) was produced in 1801 as an accurate facsimile of a Song illustrated imprint. This version, in turn, is a modern facsimile of the 1801 edition, with excellent reproductions of its many fine black-and-white woodcut illustrations and accompanying text. Guo Pu (276-324) of the Jin dynasty is credited as compiling and annotating this version of the 'Erya' which has claims to being considered the first Chinese dictionary. It is basically a philologically valuable collection of early glosses on words in pre-Qin period texts, probably assembled during the Qin or early Han dynasty. This version is a very accurate reproduction of the 1801 edition. In three volumes. The first volume comprises juan Shang and juan Zhong (Parts One and Two); the second volume is juan Xia qian (Part Three; 1), the third and final volume is juan Xia hou Part Three: 2). All text in Chinese. An excellent thing, very well-produced and in a small edition of just 300 copies. Went immediately out-of-print and very difficult to find.

Well-produced and well-illustrated catalogue of the superb and rarely-seen Five Dynasties Yue kiln celadons known as 'mise' wares. They come from the tomb of Qian Liu (852-932) the first king of the Wuyue kingdom and are held in the Lin'an Museum in Hangzhou close to the tomb site. These mise wares bear resemblance to the ru ware of the Northern Song and were much coveted. Whilst a number of these wares have been published before, the photography here is excellent and allows true appreciation of these sublime pieces. Colour plates throughout. Text in Chinese.

The exhibition draws on the host museum's excellent collections plus many important loans from museums and institutions elsewhere in north China and Inner Mongolia. Hundreds of important artefacts are illustrated in colour and well described. Includes gold, silver, pottery and porcelain, paintings, bronzes and metalwork, very rare glass and much more. Many of the exhibits never previously published. Numerous essays and articles accompany. Text in Chinese. Difficult to obtain.

Based on the copy held in the National Library of China that is the first edition produced in the tenth year of the Chongzhen reign, 1637. All text in Chinese. The six volumes comprising the facsimile are accompanied by a supplement volume explaining the history and importance of the work. Produced in a limited edition of 600 copies and immediately out-of-print.

Catalogue of an exhibition at the Capital Museum in Beijing being the first public showing of the extraordinary and highly-important recent archaeological finds from the Han dynasty Haihunhou site near Nanchang in China's Jiangxi province. The very well-preserved tomb excavated was that of Liu He, the grandson of the Han dynasty Emperor Wu. Liu He ruled China for a mere 27 days, was then deposed and made a Marquis, the first ruler of the short-lived Haihun kingdom. The tomb was intact and is, not least, remarkable for the large amounts of large round and hoof-shaped gold coins found within, together with some 2 million bronze coins - a good number shown in the exhibition. There are also gold-inlaid bronze bells, an exquisite pair of small inlaid bronze shields with designs of animals and birds, small jades, bronzes, lacquer, two goose-shaped 'smoke-catching' lamps and much more of a very high quality. The exhibition showed a total of some 300 items from the tomb, many illustrated here. The catalogue also shows the excavation process. Illustrated throughout in colour. Text in Chinese.

Large and weighty catalogue of an amazing exhibition exploring the sumptuous birthday celebrations and associated rituals, gifts and tributes to the emperors and empresses throughout the Qing dynasty up to and including the Guangxu emperor and dowager empress Cixi.

The exhibition was in six sections: Attaining Longevity Together; Birthday Celebrations in the Capital; Reverently Presenting Birthday Gifts; Birthday Celebrations in the Grand Hall; Sumptuous Banquets; Auspicious Birthday Operas. Whilst the exhibition covered imperial birthday celebrations throughout the Qing dynasty, there was a focus on the celebrations of emperors and empresses who had attained their 60th and 80th birthdays - both highly auspicious anniversaries.

Many of the exhibits (over 500!) were quite extraordinary, of the highest quality, and rarely-seen before. A huge 16 panel double-sided screen (with calligraphy by the emperors sons and embroidery) commissioned for the Kangxi Emperors 60th birthday (painstakingly restored for this exhibition), gifts produced with the rarest and finest materials, birthday robes and gowns, theatre costumes and many associated objects decorated with auspicious emblems and symbols.

Amongst many highlights was a 40 metre long and hugely-detailed scroll painting showing street celebrations for the Kangxi emperor's 60th birthday. The scroll begins at the gates of the Garden of Everlasting Spring (Changchunyuan at Yuanmingyuan) and follows the route of the emperor's procession and ends at the north Gate of Military Prowess (Shenwu Men) of the Forbidden City. This scroll painting formed the basis for the woodblock-printed book 'Wanshou Shengdian Tu'. The exhibition also had numerous other superb and rarely-seen paintings including 'Twenty-Seven Elders Travelling to the Fragrant Hills' and full length imperial birthday portraits. Much Kangxi, Qianlong and late 19th century material. All illustrated in fine colour plates.

A number of essays accompany which explore various aspects of the birthday rituals and celebrations and there is a detailed chronology of the complex celebrations organized for the 80th birthday of the empress downger Chongqing, the mother of the Qianlong emperor.

Foreword, introductions to sections, abstracts to essays and captions to plates in English. Main text in Chinese. An excellent visual and research reference on an important aspect of Qing court life which can be extrapolated to such celebrations throughout Chinese imperial history.

This catalogue has proved highly difficult to source. As with another superb exhibition catalogue of an important Gugong exhibition in 2015, it would appear that nearly all of the edition of this catalogue was retained to present as official gifts to celebrate the 90th anniversary of the founding of the Gugong Museum. We have managed to obtain just a couple of copies.

The Yangshifang was the architectural bureau of the Qing imperial government, responsible for the design and construction of imperial palaces, temples and other government structures. The Yangshifang was overseen for eight generations by the famous Lei family of architects and responsible for many hugely important imperial buildings now designated World Heritage Sites, not least the Qing Summer Resort at Chengde and the Old Summer Palace, the Yuanmingyuan. This fascinating four-volume work draws on the Lei family archives of building plans for palaces and structures at Yuanmingyuan and is a significant advance in our understanding of the architecture of this now-destroyed imperial complex much loved by the Qing emperors. In addition to illustration of many plans of buildings, floor plans, layouts etc., there is visual reconstruction of how the palaces, halls and other buildings would have looked in their heyday. Focuses on the Chinese part of the gardens (about which so little is known) but volume 4 contains material relating to the European-style palaces. A valuable study reference. Text in Chinese. The culmination of many years work and originally published as part of the celebrations for the 300th anniversary of the establishment of the imperial resort at Chengde, this is an edited and re-set edition of the rare gazetteer or local history of Chengde and environs commissioned by the Qianlong Emperor. When Sir Percival David formed his collection of Chinese ceramics, his approach was governed to some extent by two important Chinese works on collecting: the Ko Ku Yao Lun (The Essential Criteria of Antiquities) written in 1388 by Cao Chao. David later translated and edited this work. The second book of influence was Chu Yan's Tao Shuo of 1774, translated by Bushell as: Description of Chinese Pottery and Porcelain. Thus, discerning buying, governed by the dictates of Chinese connoisseurship, distinguishes the David collection - with a marked accent on imperial taste. Indeed, the collection includes a number of exquisite and important Song pieces from the former Chinese imperial holdings in Peking. A collection renowned for its quality and for important pieces from the Song through to the Qing dynasties. One of the most beautifully-produced English books of the period. Rare. Jin Jian was made Superintendent of Wuyingdian (The Imperial Printing Press) in 1773 and supervised work for compiling the part of the Siku Quanshu project whereby reprints of rare works were made, some copied from the Yongle Dadian. Jin Jian proposed that these reprints be made using movable wooden type, which the Emperor approved. Thereafter, in the course of six months, a set of about 253,000 wooden type in two sizes was completed. Qianlong gave this method of movable type printing (usually known as Huozi Ban) the name 'Wuyingdian Juzhenban' and wrote a poem to commemorate the initiation of the project. By 1777 over 30 works had been printed and Jin Jian published, also using movable type, an illustrated work (as here) on the project and the process of the printing. The work contains information and reproduction of documents relating to the enterprise and is illustrated with 16 appealing woodcut illustrations showing the process and stages in producing movable type and its preparation for use in printing. By the time of the completion of the project (around 1794), 134 works had been published and were brought together in a collectanea known as the Wuyingdian Juzhenban Congshu. 

A huge variety of decorative features of the palace buildings in Peking are illustrated. In addition to the decoration on the buildings, there are also a number of vignettes showing palace and hall interiors. Moves on to the seals of imperial and personal authority (Huangdi zhi Bao, Qianlong Huangdi zhi Bao), seals of palaces and halls in the Forbidden City (Wuying Dian, Yangxin Dian, Qianqing Gong etc.), seals used at other residences such as the Yuanmingyuan and Bishu Shanzhuang (Chengde). There follow numerous lesser seals used by the Emperor in his personal life and collecting such as seals from Sanxi Tang and other studios, seals used for the imperial painting collections and connoisseurship down to numerous minor seals. The seals are taken from paintings, imperial edicts etc. held in the Forbidden City collection and the Chinese State Archives. All seals are reproduced in their original size.

Of the approximately 1100 seals, six are actual hand-done impressions from the original seals themselves. Following the expulsion of the last Emperor, Pu Yi, from the Forbidden City at the end of 1924, the Chinese Government established a committee (Qing Shi Shan Hou Weiyuan Hui) to undertake a complete survey and listing of the objects and treasures in the Forbidden City. The committee surveyed the imperial complex, palace by palace and hall by hall, from 1925-30, systematically and exhaustively listing the contents of each, from cloisonné and paintings to rare books, imperial edicts, furniture and jades. This is a facsimile of their report. The original was never generally available, being held for the sole use of government officials, due to its political sensitivity at the time. This report remains the most comprehensive and complete listing of the treasures of the Gugong and was undertaken at a time when the imperial collection was intact in one place — particularly important given that many of the treasures are now divided between Beijing and Taibei. Over 1.1 million objects are described. The importance of this work is further enhanced in that it also contains (in volume 10) the 1933 government survey of the objects and treasures held in the Summer Palace (the Yiheyuan) entitled 'Diancha Beiping Yiheyuan Liuping Wupin Qing Ce'. Again, the original of this report is very elusive. A prime research and reference tool on the Chinese imperial collection, the use and function of halls and palaces, the original locations of objects. Regrettably not illustrated. In Chinese.

A detailed and substantial, indeed, magnificent, four-volume publication comprising the results of a photographic survey undertaken at Chengde in the early 1930s by Prof. T. Sekino and T. Takeshima who travelled extensively in Northern China during this period. This huge report is the prime historical visual reference on the imperial Qing dynasty Summer Resort at Chengde, the Bishu Shanzhuang, and the surrounding temples. No work has yet surpassed the detail of this publication. The complex was also known as Jehol - or 'Nekka' in Japanese. Shows the imperial park, its buildings and pavilions plus the surrounding temples in their original condition but in a very neglected and dilapidated state. Contains five colour and hundreds of black-and-white collotype plates. An important and extremely rare early visual resource on this imperial complex. Contents pages and captions to plates in both English and Japanese. Produced to a very high standard.

In addition to the four volumes of photography, this set also has the smaller text volume which was issued later in 1937, following Sekino's death. The text volume has a list of contents, two page preface, two page foreword, list of plans, list of illustrations and 28 page summary in English. Main text in Japanese. The text volume was not published with the plate volumes as Sekino made a second trip to Chengde and wanted the text volume to incorporate the findings of this second trip. The photographic illustrations in the text volume are of interest as a number of them were taken in 1909 by a local Chinese photographer and obtained by Sekino and Takeshima on their first visit. The text volume was also only available to those who had subscribed to the four volumes of plates - themselves issued in two stages. It explains the extreme rarity of this work as a set.

The four volumes of plates have been deaccessioned from a Northeast China institution, the text volume deaccessioned from Cornell University Library. The volumes of plates with library stamps to frontpapers and with a small unobtrusive red library stamp in the margin of each plate alongside the captions and, occasionally, a larger round stamp again to the margin of a plate. The plates themselves clean. The text volume with a couple of library stamps to frontpapers, otherwise clean.

In general, slight wear, fading and rubbing to the covers but all volumes good and sturdy. Slight marks and occasional foxing to the black-and-white plates. The foldout panorama has become detached from its mount. A good study copy of a very rare work. Priced accordingly.



High-quality facsimile produced to the original size of the unique manuscript copy produced in 'book form' of this enormous encyclopaedia, a Chinese cultural icon. The encyclopaedia was first commissioned by the Ming dynasty Yongle Emperor and produced in the form of hand-written scrolls. Completed in 1408. A manuscript copy bound in baobei zhuang form (wrapped back) as here was later ordered by the Ming dynasty Jiajing emperor and completed in 1567.

The original Yongle version disappeared long ago, presumed destroyed or perhaps buried with the Jiajing emperor. The encyclopaedia is now only known in this book form, again much destroyed and dispersed.

One of the most interesting and important aspects of this extraordinary collection of knowledge lay in the quoting of sections of text from ancient works no longer extant, lost or too delicate to be used. It is said that over 8000 texts were incorporated.

The encyclopaedia was arranged according to the Hongwu Zhengyun - a rhyming system developed at the beginning of the Ming dynasty during the reign of the founding Hongwu emperor.

This particular fascicle, comprising three juan 2345-2347 (presumably comprising Volume 101 of Section (?) 6: Mo) covers references in Chinese literature and other texts relating to birds and related topics.

Large black characters indicate the title of a section. Characters written in red indicate authors and/or titles of works. A small red circle indicates a full stop. Black characters reproduce sections of text from the classics, literature, histories and other sources.

Baobei Zhuang binding. The original fascicle is held in the National Library of China.

All text in Chinese. Beautifully produced. Has the feel of an original fascicle we have seen.

An edition of 1000 copies. Immediately went out-of-print and is now very difficult to find due to the current topicality of the Yongle Dadian in China as a cultural icon and, in particular, given that two recently-discovered fascicles have returned home from France.

The print artist, Song Hongyu, from China's Heilongjiang province, here demonstrates the strength of the creative impulse in times of adversity - namely the strict and ongoing Covid lockdown in China from early 2020 onwards. Undaunted by the cancellation of artistic projects involving travel abroad to England and Italy, the artist utilized Google maps to visualize his travels and rigourously created 165 black-and-white prints showing intimate street scenes, views and sights in Italy and England. From these he selected 100 to compile this portfolio. All very well executed. Size of actual printed area of each print is 12x15 cm.





Rest of the World: by banker's draft drawn on a UK bank. Other forms of payment should be accompanied by an extra GB £15.00 to cover bank charges.
